	ML noted that there has been a rise in tenants breaking the rules	
	on the river, the Board agreed that the bailiffs should deal with breaches in the first instance and regular offenders are to be	
	dealt with more seriously, with the matter being escalated. Any	
	major breach may need to be dealt serious from the outset

	 depending on the circumstance but the discretion is with the Bailiffing team, unless it is an illegal act. The Board discussed individual cases of tenant breaches. ML ran over access issues that the team have been encountering, which is having an impact on the tenants and the river. This has become time consuming in the last few years and takes the bailiffs away from other jobs. A seasonal ranger has been proposed, who would work for 3 to 4 months of the summer to help monitor the river during the day. NW ran over the finances of a seasonal ranger. The Board agreed that a ranger should be employed for the 2023 season going forward.
